


## Construction Update for the Week of August 27

Crews are working on several projects north of Washington Street to make Old Town Algonquin a welcoming place to gather for all visitors. Concrete seat walls, which are designed to allow visitors to relax and hang out in an inviting atmosphere that includes new raised planter beds, will be built this week.

Other work scheduled for the week includes new ramps compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) at two locations and new curbs along Main Street from the Bypass to Crystal Creek.

People traveling to Main Street businesses and residences are allowed to drive northbound on Main Street during construction. Northbound traffic on Main Street from the Bypass to Washington Street will be shifted to the west half of the street and may then continue one-way north of Washington Street to a temporary ramp next to Crystal Creek to access Harrison Street. Parking is available in the Village's parking lot on the corner of Harrison and Washington streets.
