


Construction Update for the Week of September 2



Excitement builds in Old Town as crews work to prepare for the decorative features that are being added to the bridge. Crews are in the process of installing new masonry columns on the bridge and construction of the pedestrian pergola over the walkway will begin this week. These features will help create a unique gateway to the downtown, welcoming residents and visitors to the restaurants, businesses and shops along Main Street.

Construction will also shift focus to the north side of bridge, where concrete will be poured to connect the bridge to the roadway.


Once the sidewalk connections are completed and safe for pedestrians, the bridge will be opened to pedestrian traffic while crews complete the utilities and new streetscape elements being added to Main Street on the north side of the bridge.



On Tuesday, Sept. 3, construction of new storm sewer and water mains will also begin on Harrison Street. The current detour impacting the section of Main Street south of Algonquin Road remains in place during bridge construction. As a reminder **public parking is available** along Main Street south of the bridge or in the parking lots located behind Bold American Fare Restaurant or at the corner of Harrison and Washington streets. The parking lot located behind Bold American Fare can be accessed directly from IL 62.
