



## Construction Update for the Week of September 30



New brick pavers have been installed along the north section of Main Street between the bridge and Algonquin Road. The pavers create the same charm and character that was created south of the bridge along Main Street.

The installation of the pavers have created a safe walkway for pedestrians, which will allow the Village to reopen the west side of Main Street south of Algonquin Road to pedestrians next week. Pedestrians can walk along Main Street over the new bridge and enjoy the pedestrian pergola.

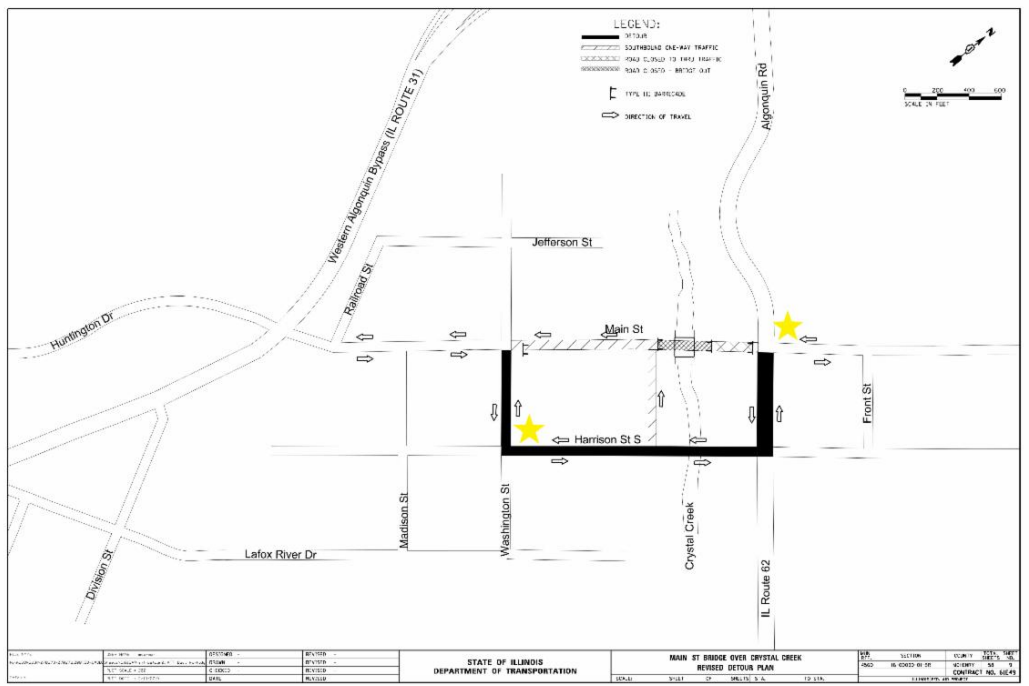


Crews have also been working to connect the roadway to the bridge structure along Main Street. We expect to reopen the roadway by mid October to motorists traveling southbound from Algonquin Road. Utility work will continue on the east side of the roadway. Once this work is complete, the roadway will reopen in both directions to both motorists and pedestrians.

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The current detour impacting the section of Main Street south of Algonquin Road remains in place during bridge construction. As a reminder, **public parking is available** along Main Street south of the bridge or in the parking lots located behind Bold American Fare Restaurant or at the corner of Harrison and Washington streets. The parking lot located behind Bold American Fare can be accessed directly from IL 62.
