

Dear Algonquin Residents and Business Owners,

The Village is continuing its efforts to improve the underground infrastructure in order to ensure that our sanitary sewer and water main infrastructure meet capacity needs and are in good working order before we begin the Streetscape work on North Harrison. On **Tuesday, September 3**, the contractor will begin replacing these critical pieces of infrastructure.

Harrison Street north of Front Street will be closed to traffic until the work is substantially complete and meets safety requirements. Construction message boards are currently onsite to inform drivers about detours and construction.



The work will consist of the following:

- Installation of new interceptor sanitary sewer and manholes from Front Street north to approximately 925 N. Harrison Street. The new sewers will provide additional capacity and eliminate extraneous storm water from the sanitary sewer.
- The sanitary sewer will be placed at a depth of 12-20 feet below existing ground level throughout this stretch.
- New sanitary sewer services for each lot from the new sanitary main up to the Village ROW/ property line or approximately 10-15 feet behind the curb.
- Installation of new water main on Edward Street between Main and Harrison streets.
- Minor storm sewer work on Edward Street.

This project will require numerous types of construction equipment on Harrison Street to excavate and backfill the pipe that is being installed, therefore traffic will **NOT** be able to pass through the active construction zone. Access to businesses and homes may be challenging when the installation/ excavation is directly adjacent to the impacted properties. Notification will be provided directly to the businesses and residents when this occurs.

As with all construction projects, the work will be completed weather and conditions permitting, but is anticipated to be substantially complete by the end of 2019. The contractor plans on working **10 hour days during the work week and on Saturdays** to make as much progress as possible to limit impact to residents and businesses. We anticipate there will be inconveniences during this period of construction; we will do our best to keep them to a minimum.
