



## Construction Update: April 11

This week, crews started the process of installing the de-watering wells along La Fox River Drive south of the Prairie Trail pedestrian bridge. These temporary wells will lower the ground water elevation and keep trenches dry, allowing the utility work to occur. On Sunday, residents will see the contractor on site to refuel the generators needed for the wells.

Crews will continue installing the wells along La Fox River Drive between the Prairie Path pedestrian bridge and Washington Street in the coming week. Additionally, crews will saw cut the roadway along La Fox River Drive in preparation for the upcoming underground sanitary sewer work.

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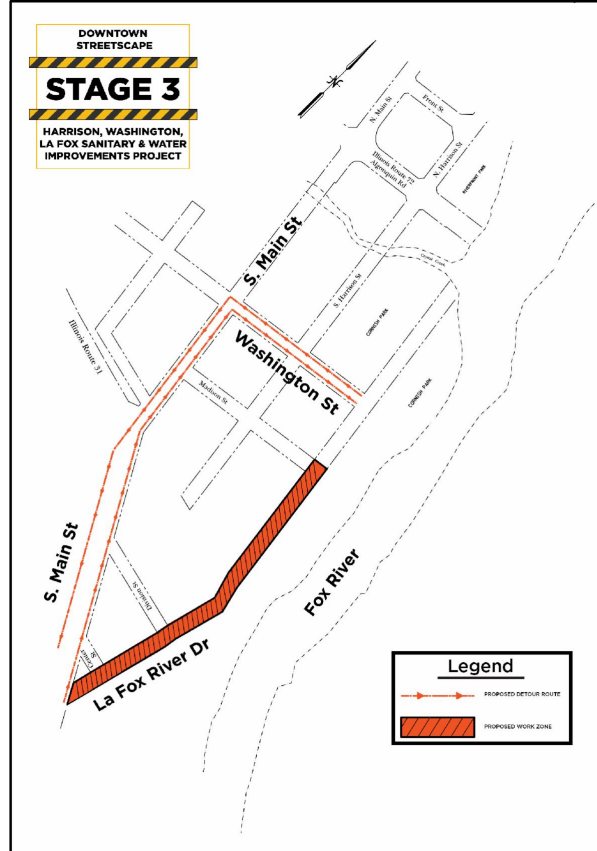
On Monday, crews will begin removing the bridge and abutments (concrete supports on either side of the road) for the Prairie Path pedestrian/bicycle bridge over La Fox River Drive. Please note that La Fox River Drive will be impassable as the pedestrian bridge is being removed. 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### **Detour:**

Traffic will be routed along Route 31 to Main Street and then back to Washington Street and La Fox River Drive.

We ask that drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists use caution due to the level of construction equipment along La Fox River Drive.



This project is expected to take 10 months to complete. We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding as we invest in this important infrastructure project to improve the community.
